T. S. ELIOT PRIZE 2023

RULES & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY



A prize of £25,000 will be awarded to the best collection of new poetry in English first published in the UK or the Republic of Ireland in 2023 (1 January 2023 – 31 December 2023). The ten shortlisted poets will also each receive a cheque for £1,500. Full information at **tseliot.com/prize**

RULES & ELIGIBILITY

- Submitted poetry collections must have been published in the UK or Republic of Ireland.
- First publication in the UK or the Republic of Ireland may include simultaneous publication (within a period of one year) in other countries.
- Poetry collections must be submitted by the publisher.
- Entries from individual poets of their own work will not be accepted. This includes self-published collections.
- A collection must be the work of one poet. Anthologies and volumes of collected or selected work will
 not be eligible.
- A posthumous collection will be eligible only if published within one year of the poet's death.
- A 'book' shall in this case be defined as having at least 48 pages of printed poems.
- At least 80 per cent of the poems in the collection must not have been published before in book form.
- Books which contain more than 30 per cent translations (or versions, imitations or any poetry inspired
 by the work of one or more other writers) will not be eligible. Percentages should be calculated on the
 total number of lines of poetry in a book.

SUBMISSIONS

- The deadline for submissions is Thursday 27 July 2023 at 17:00.

THE JUDGING

- There are three judges on the judging panel. The 2023 Prize judges are: Paul Muldoon (Chair), Sasha Dugdale and Denise Saul.
- Each judge will have one vote. In the event of a tied vote, the Chair will have the casting vote.
- The final judging will take place and the Prize will be awarded in mid-January 2024.

THE SHORTLIST

- A shortlist of books selected for the Prize will be announced in late October 2023.
- The shortlist will comprise not more than ten books.
- Books originally submitted in manuscript or proof form must also be provided as published finished copies once shortlisted.
- Publishers of shortlisted titles are asked to provide an additional 20 published copies for promotional purposes. PDFs must also be supplied.

T. S. ELIOT PRIZE MARKETING & PROMOTION

Between one and three poems from each of the shortlisted titles will be reproduced on press releases, the T. S. Eliot Prize website, in social media and in press releases and emails for the purposes of marketing the relevant book, the Readings or the Prize itself.

Shortlisted poets will be invited to record videos of their poems for the T. S. Eliot Prize YouTube channel and other media use (TV, radio, the web etc) specifically related to the promotion of the Prize.
