T. S. ELIOT PRIZE 2025

RULES & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY



A prize of £25,000 will be awarded to the best collection of new poetry in English first published in the UK or the Republic of Ireland in 2025 (1 January to 31 December 2025). All shortlisted poets receive a cheque for £1,500. Full information at tseliot.com/prize

RULES & ELIGIBILITY

- Submitted poetry collections must have been published in the UK or Republic of Ireland.
- First publication in the UK or the Republic of Ireland may include simultaneous publication (within a period of one year) in other countries.
- Poetry collections must be submitted by the publisher.
- Entries from individual poets of their own work will not be accepted. This includes self-published collections.
- A collection must be the work of one poet. Anthologies and volumes of collected or selected work will
 not be eligible.
- A posthumous collection will be eligible only if published within one year of the poet's death.
- A 'book' shall in this case be defined as having at least 48 pages of printed poems.
- At least 80 per cent of the poems in the collection must not have been published before in book form.
- Books which contain more than 30 per cent translations (or versions, imitations or any poetry inspired by the work of one or more other writers) will not be eligible. Percentages should be calculated on the total number of lines of poetry in a book.
- There is no limit on the number of titles that may be submitted, so long as each entry complies with Prize criteria.

SUBMISSIONS

- The deadline for submissions is Thursday 31 July 2025 at 17:00 BST.

THE JUDGING

- There are three judges on the judging panel. The 2025 Prize judges are: Michael Hofmann (Chair),
 Patience Agbabi and Niall Campbell.
- Each judge will have one vote. In the event of a tied vote, the Chair will have the casting vote.
- The final judging will take place and the Prize will be awarded in mid-January 2026.

THE SHORTLIST

- The Shortlist of books selected for the Prize will be announced in early October 2025.
- The Shortlist will comprise not more than ten books.
- Titles originally submitted in as page proofs or manuscripts must also be provided as published books once shortlisted.

MARKETING & PROMOTION

- Publishers of shortlisted titles are asked to provide an additional 25 published copies for promotional purposes (sets are supplied to the participants in the Young Critics Scheme run in conjunction with The Poetry Society's Young Poets Network).
- High-resolution cover JPEGs, poet's headshots and book PDFs must also be supplied.
- Between one and three poems from each of the shortlisted titles may be reproduced on press releases, the T. S. Eliot Prize website, in Readers' Notes and the Shortlist Readings programme, as well as on social media and in Prize e-newsletters for the purposes of marketing the relevant book, the Readings or the Prize itself.
- Shortlisted poets will be invited to record videos of their poems for the T. S. Eliot Prize YouTube channel and other media use (TV, radio, web etc) specifically related to the promotion of the Prize.
